

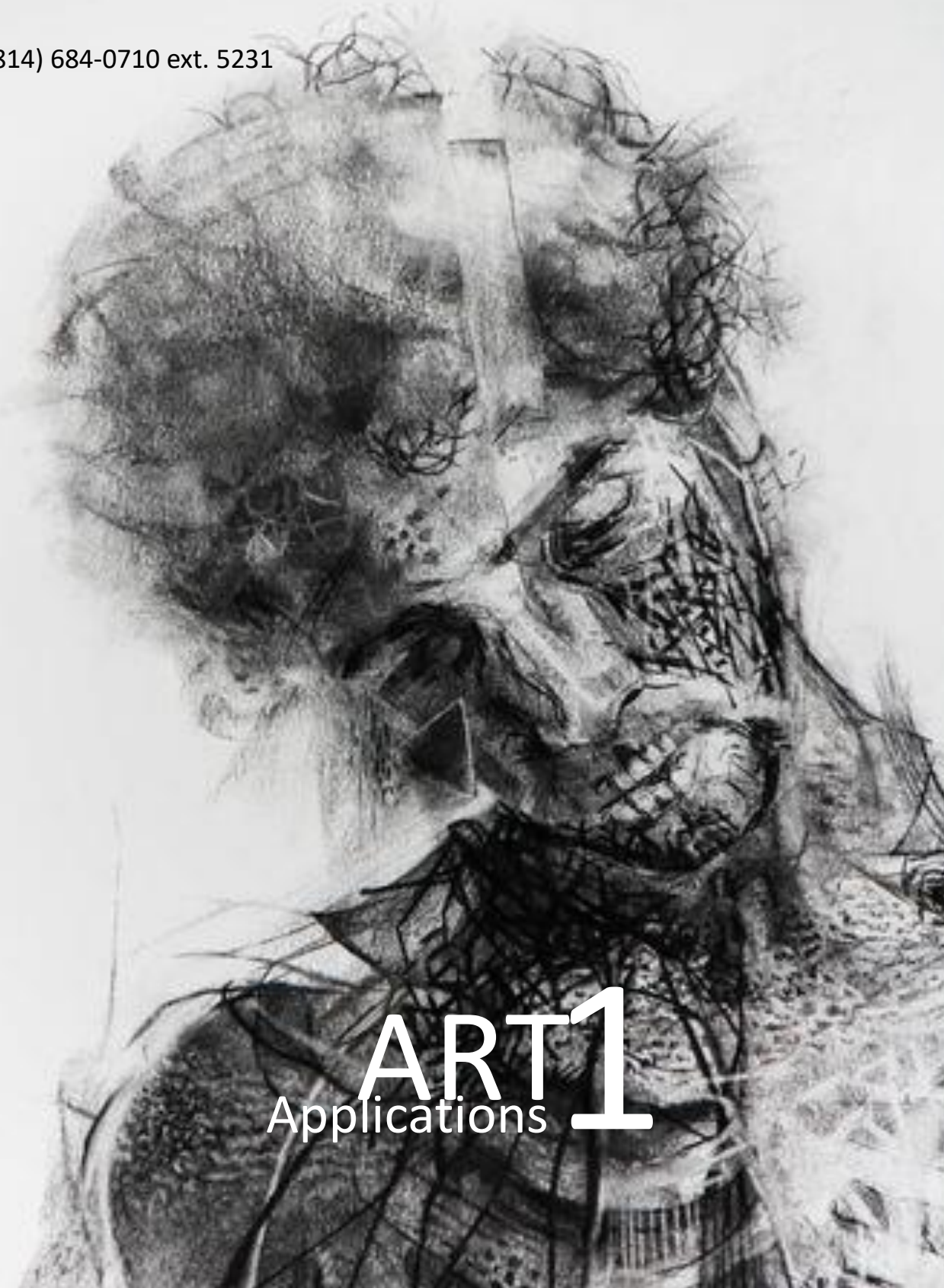

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## Course Description

Art Applications 1 is a year-long course designed to introduce students to the foundations of Visual Arts and the techniques of rendering in both a two-dimensional and three-dimensional space.

Students will learn:

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Various techniques working in art mediums (pencil, watercolor, acrylic, clay, charcoal, ink)

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Vocab associated with two-dimensional and three-dimensional design

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The production of functional and non-functional art

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Technical, historical, aesthetic, cultural, and contemporary concerns of artists

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To develop your own personal and artistic way of creating

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During the year, we will have group discussions, teacher presentations and demonstrations, student self-guided research, class critiques, and skill development/ planning assignments. Students are expected to participate in class discussions and give input surrounding their opinions and thoughts about the discussion. Students are expected to take notes on art vocabulary and process steps during demonstration.
